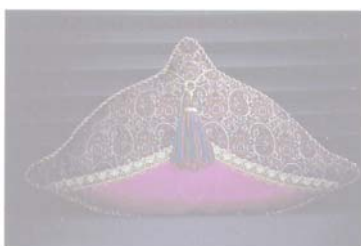

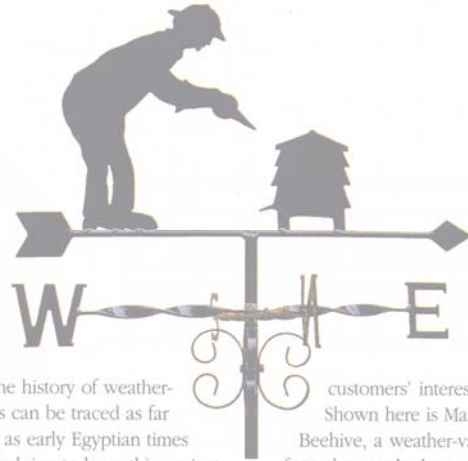
Beautiful hand-painted cast signs based on original designs produced by village blacksmiths in the 19th Century but with the convenience of modern materials.

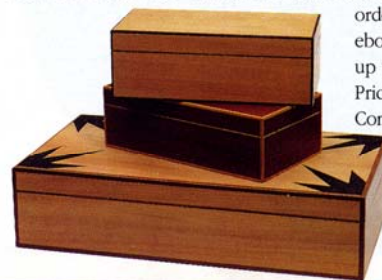
△ The history of weather-vanes can be traced as far back as early Egyptian times and helping to keep this ancient practice alive today is Dorset-based Graham Smith. Graham is one of very few people in the country to make hand-cut weather-vanes, but although he has over 30 different designs ranging from golfers to dragons, his real love is making one-off designs to reflect his

customers' interests. Shown here is Man and Beehive, a weather-vane from the standard range, price £75 plus £6 p and p.
